### QUICK FACTS

#### LATE HEADING

**SPARTA** is one of the latest maturing varieties available on the market, with a heading date that is usually about a week later than Pennlate. The excellent disease resistance and good winterhardiness of **SPARTA** combine to give long stand life and good stand density. The winterhardiness is good compared to other late maturing varieties. In Europe, **SPARTA** is used in cold countries such as Austria and Russia with good success. **SPARTA** has excellent resistance to rust, a disease that can drastically lower the palatability of forage.

Late maturity orchardgrass is in high demand for using in mixtures with alfalfa. The maturity of Sparta is similar to the flowering date of alfalfa, which will result in much higher forage quality compared to earlier maturing varieties.
